

50 YEARS IN THE FORGING OF A SOCIETY

El Sistema is the world's largest social and musical organization, created in Venezuela 50 years ago by maestro and economist José Antonio Abreu.

A pedagogical model, now expanded to more than 70 countries, which in Venezuela provides free training to more than 1.3 million children and young people, served in 443 centers and 2,351 modules distributed throughout the country.

It is a powerful network of academic music education throughout the country, consisting of 13 professional orchestras, 1,652 orchestral groups, 1,470 choral groups, 511 musical initiation groups, 459 traditional Venezuelan music groups, and 162 popular music groups.

With a robust academic structure that includes 12 academic programs, 19 established music schools and 11 in the process of being organized, 1 music conservatory and 18 extensions, as well as 14 instrument making and manufacturing centers that have transformed the way music is approached from childhood, reaching all strata of society with gender equality.

Its methodology, based on innovation and collective music practice, reflects artistic excellence while remaining at the forefront of contemporary educational best practices.

It incorporates instrumental technique, a deep understanding of musical performance, and art appreciation.

El Sistema is constantly evolving socially, educationally, and artistically. Its goal is to double its enrollment and expand its global network. Through its exchange platform, it connects with Institutions around the world to share knowledge and experiences that promote human development and cultural exchanges, such as the creation of a World System of Orchestras and Choirs.

In addition to transforming the lives of thousands of children and young people through music, El Sistema also sows the seeds of profound social change. Its style, marked by discipline, teamwork, and excellence, forges intellectual and emotional character in children and young people that stay with them throughout their lives.

Every member of El Sistema, even if they do not continue in music, they can achieve personal and professional growth that will be significant in any field, thanks to the values implanted in them, such as perseverance, respect, and responsibility. These values promote the construction of a dignified, successful, cultured Venezuela that is connected to a collective ideal of nationhood.

Through consolidated management of modern administrative practices, professional excellence, and joint development, this organization promotes a model of quality and establishes itself as an example of comprehensive human development based on a culture of peace.

For these reasons, during its five decades of existence, it has consolidated the support of strategic alliances that allow this movement to transcend borders and become a global benchmark.

El Sistema is and will always be a small country that reflects wonderful results, the product of the unification of wills of all its parts, with the concurrence of great ideas carried out with excellence and quality as a guide, where evolution is a permanent initiative, based on the rescue of human sensitivity, so necessary today in Venezuela and in the world.

El Sistema will continue for many years to come, playing, singing, striving, and making music from Venezuela for the world.

SIMÓN BOLÍVAR MUSIC FOUNDATION

On February 20, 1979, the State Foundation for the National System of Youth and Children's Orchestras of Venezuela (FESNOJIV) was established with the aim of training highly qualified human resources in the field of music and obtaining the necessary funding for the implementation of plans, activities, and programs. This is the first date on which the Venezuelan State gave its unrestricted support to this educational, cultural, and social program, which has been maintained consecutively and has been welcomed by all Venezuelan governments.

In 2011, by order of the Presidency of the Republic, the name FESNOJIV was changed to Fundación Musical Simón Bolívar and was attached to the Ministry of the People's Power of the Office of the Presidency and Monitoring of the Management of the Government of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela.

The Simón Bolívar Musical Foundation is the governing body of El Sistema, an Institution open to all Venezuelan society, which has a flexible, innovative, and dynamic management structure perfectly designed and adapted to the philosophy and objectives of El Sistema.

The Foundation is the legal and administrative platform designed to facilitate and implement all programs, agreements, exchanges, and arrangements with decentralized public administration bodies, Venezuelan and foreign government entities, and private companies. It is also the entity through which financial resources are obtained from the Venezuelan State and national and international organizations.

This Institution has established a managerial administrative model throughout the national territory, which governs the network of youth and children's orchestras and choirs, all the pedagogical centers and the teachers, administrative staff, by respecting the idiosyncrasy of every region.

ACADEMIC STRUCTURE

The pedagogical distribution of El Sistema has a structure around three main pillars: the Strategic Level, linked to the Executive Management, the Academic Council, and the Musical Management; the Tactical Level, made up of the Sectorial Academic Training Office; and the Operational Level, which is managed by the National Center for Social Action through Music, the Orchestral and Choral Management Office, the Núcleos Management Office, the State Management Office, the Academic Music Office, El Sistema Programs, and El Sistema Schools. Through these important pillars and their components, strategic planning, systematic support, action plans, project execution, and the presentation of results are developed.

STRATEGIC LEVEL

- Executive Direction: strategically designs action plans that lead to the achievement of El Sistema's objectives.
- Academic Council: acts as an advisory and support arm for the academic, artistic, and musical projects that the institution promotes for the development of its activities and the achievement of its objectives.
- **Musical Direction:** generates plans and strategies to be followed in the artistic and musical areas in order to promote El Sistema's artistic and musical activities.

TACTICAL LEVEL

• Academic Training Sector Management: formulates policies, guidelines, and strategies that guide the development and strengthening of El Sistema's academic and musical structure, in order to guarantee the comprehensive training of its beneficiaries, providing the necessary support to achieve objectives set within the established time frame.

OPERATIONAL LEVEL

- National Center for Social Action through Music Office: it encompasses El Sistema's headquarters for educational, musical, and artistic exchange in the Americas, through the coordination of activities with the several agencies involved in order to promote the headquarters as the most important artistic and academic space, both nationally and internationally.
- Orchestral, Choral, and Popular Music Management: promotes the design and management of strategies that include planning, organization, implementation, evaluation, and control of activities and projects related to El Sistema's professional orchestras and choirs with a view of promoting them nationally and internationally as groups of high artistic and academic caliber.

- **Núcleos 's Management:** plans, manages, controls, and ensures the sustainability of the administrative and academic organization known as El Núcleo, promoting access for children and young people to comprehensive academic music training, with the aim of fostering social integration between children, families, and communities through the collective practice of music.
- **State Management:** the 28 management teams that integrate it manage the operation and academic and administrative development of the nuclei and modules of each state, following the quidelines issued by the Nuclei Directorate and with the support of the bodies of the Institution.
- Research and Documentation Center: develops humanistic and scientific knowledge through research, systematization, and dissemination of the academic musical structures of El Sistema's pedagogical, artistic, and social inclusion methodology as an exemplary model at the national and international levels.
- **Virtual Núcleo:** as part of the technological innovations, the Virtual Núcleo is formed, which develops and provides technological tools so that the different Programs and Schools of The Sistema can digitize virtual storage content, including courses, workshops, and online classes, which will be available to all beneficiaries who are members of the núcleos at the national level.



LEARNING PATH

The Sistema's academic path consists of educational spaces designed to maintain a linear educational sequence in which progressive steps are taken to enable the academic, professional, and artistic growth of the institution's members. The educational path has two important aspects:


- The physical structures contained in the Núcleos and Academic Centers, where members are served through schools and programs.
- The program content included in the Conservatories and the University, where the Schools and Professional and Regional Groups are developed:
- **Núcleo:** the 443 núcleos nationwide, which are the central and primary organizational structures of El Sistema with the purpose of systematizing the collective practice of music as a formative, humanistic, and socially inclusive model, where the programs and schools are developed.
- Regional Academic Center: 46 academic centers nationwide that constitute the academic space where educational processes for children and young people are developed, at an intermediate level of the núcleos located within their radius of action, and in turn, pilot and experimental projects for all programs and schools are generated.
- Conservatory: a private, experimental training center where human resources are trained. It links teaching, research, and outreach activities to transform the academic profile, raising awareness of its social role and leadership through its musical, technical, pedagogical, and research work. As part of the academic structure of El Sistema, it operates with its headquarters in Caracas and simultaneously 18 extensions nationwide that implement the same academic program in conjunction with the State Management of El Sistema and a coordination in each region. These extensions operate in: Miranda: Altos Mirandinos, Guatire Guarenas, Barlovento, Cojedes, Portuguesa, Táchira, Mérida, Trujillo, Zulia, Falcón, Anzoátegui, Sucre, Nueva Esparta, Lara, Yaracuy, Bolívar, Aragua, and Amazonas.
- Regional groups: belonging to the various El Sistema programs that operate in different regions of the country, where children and young people develop artistically through the collective practice of music, performing a sequential repertoire in accordance with their individual training. The young and the children developed themselves in an artistic way.
- **Professional groups:** where schools that work on more demanding and difficult technical and artistic pieces are highly developed. These pieces are presented on national and international stages, generating comments that praise the work of Maestro José Antonio Abreu.

Programs: guided by El Sistema teaching method, they promote the training, artistic development, and social motivation of children and young people in different musical genres and areas of training, keeping the philosophy of collective practice as a teaching methodology and mechanism for social inclusion in the núcleos and academic centers.

Schools: responsible for the academic development and training process of technical and musical instrumental and choral improvement of members from the moment they enter the núcleos, through the intermediate level implemented in academic centers and conservatories, until they reach the professional level within the José Antonio Abreu University Higher Education project.

Levels of attention in El Sistema schools:

- **Teachers:** musicians who educate the young members of professional groups, national leaders of El Sistema schools.
- **Trainers:** teachers with extensive musical experience and a history at the state level, as well as young members of professional orchestras responsible for training monitors and members of regional groups.
- **Monitors:** musicians who are members of regional groups or teachers with a local track record responsible for providing academic support to members of youth and children's groups in the núcleos.
- Support staff: administrative personnel responsible for the day-to-day operation of the núcleos.

TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATIONS

Interactive Web platform for study, which will promote the musical growth of El Sistema's students, reinforcing their education through multimedia content; it will also serve as an online follow-up tool for El Sistema's programs and schools to train and assist directors, teachers, monitors and students.

It is intended, among other aspects, to generate interactive mechanisms to control the academic processes in "El Sistema's" centers and schools, thus facilitating the training of teachers, directors, and students.

The Centre for Research and Documentation (CIDES)

It offers a set of highly effective services and is committed to responding to the needs of the researcher; it guides the feasibility and realization of scientific, humanistic, and socio-cultural studies.

In addition, CIDES aims to systematize and disseminate all the academic, musical, and artistic structures of the pedagogical model of El Sistema as an exemplary practice at national and international level to a larger number of individuals and institutions.



THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR SOCIAL ACTION THROUGH MUSIC

The Venezuelan music venue

Since its inauguration on February 12, 2011, everyone who enters at the National Center for Social Action through Music (CNASPM), the headquarters of El Sistema, feels the true sensation of being immersed in a work of art, a brutalist-style architectural complex (clean work) designed by Tomás Lugo.

From the access ramp, with a floor designed by Carlos Cruz-Diez, Inducción Cromática Doble Frequency Chromatic Induction), which extends throughout the ground floor, the work of Jesús Soto welcomes visitors. This is the Sphere of Musicians and its subsequent degradation in the Two-Color Rain. If you go up to the first floor, the same rain catches the observer's eye, until the gaze encounters t8hree enormous bells made by the Dutch foundry Royal Eijsbout and donated by the Hilti Foundation. But these are not mere decorations: one must wait for the right moment to place the bells in front of the open doors of the Simón Bolívar Room and let the joyful ding-dong resound.

Upon entering the Simón Bolívar Hall, the first thing that strikes you are the 888 chairs stamped with Cruz-Diez's chromographs, and as the artist said, I created a box of colors to 8sit and listen to music." The view of the seats is complemented by that of the curtain, another striking work by Cruz-Diez. This venue has a custom-made organ, built by the German company Orgelbau Klais.

Another space for music is the Fedora Alemán Hall, with 270 leather seats, expandable to 400, which provides an intimate experience and the feeling that the audience embraces the stage. It also has its own organ, designed by Venezuelan luthier Lennar Acosta.

The CNASPM also has two amphitheater halls for fifty people each, whose seats offer the same concept of a box of colors that Cruz-Diez designed for the Simón Bolívar Hall. Another space is the rehearsal room, whose outer wall borders Los Caobos Park, and a triptych of three-dimensional stained-glass windows, named Monitores by its creator, the visual artist Carlos Zerpa.

There is adjacent to Los Caobos Park the CNASPM's Acoustic Shell, with its tilting door that, when opened, provides the stage with a ceiling of acoustic panels.

In this way, art at the CNASPM surrounds the musicians, employees, visitors, and audience, because that is what the founder himself, José Antonio Abreu, wanted. His philosophy was that if the members of El Sistema were going to perform music, it was ideal for them to do so surrounded by art in order to provide a rich aesthetic experience that would offer children, young people, and adults suitable areas for musical instruction and the presentation of the results to the general public through musical events and concerts.

PROGRAMA NUEVOS INTEGRANTES The New Members Program (Nuevos Integrantes de El Sistema-NIS)

This program was created in 2012 with the aim of bringing families and their little ones closer to the wonderful world of music, from the womb to the age of three.

The New Members Program

(Nuevos Integrantes de El Sistema-NIS in Spanish) is based on orchestra-family social integration to develop children's artistic talent and give them the opportunity to join an orchestral and choral núcleo to continue their artistic training within El Sistema.

Every week, the program invites babies and their families to enjoy and participate in artistic activities. It also offers workshops that include massage therapy for both babies and pregnant mothers, as well as educational and musical activities taught by highly trained staff, ensuring comprehensive and professional care for newborns, babies, children, and families.

Currently, the NIS Program maintains its routine of social, educational, and musical outreach with its members through núcleos in the states of Apure, Aragua, Carabobo, Cojedes, the Capital District, Guárico, La Guaira, Lara, Mérida, Miranda, Nueva Esparta, and Trujillo.

PROGRAMA DE INICIACIÓN MUSICAL The Music Initiation Program (PIM) promotes direct exposure to the world of orchestras and choirs for children, young people, and adults, respecting their cognitive and emotional stage of development and contributing to their overall development.

During this stage, the aim is for children, together with their families, to have their first encounter with the orchestra, acquiring basic knowledge such as: identifying the various instruments, sections, and timbres; developing children's psychomotor skills for instrumental performance; encouraging discipline within the orchestra and paying attention to the conductor.

The PIM uses a pedagogical vision of collective music practice, and the program develops strategies that allow children to encounter music in the world of music, primarily through the organization of group and individual classes (workshops, sections, rehearsals).

For children aged 3 to 6, the proposal covers three fundamental stages. The first is musical simulation with 3-year-olds; the second corresponds to the rhythm band for 4-year-olds; and the third is instrumental or choral practice for children aged 5 to 7. The duration could be one school year for each of the stages mentioned.

It stands as the essential methodological foundation of this Institution aimed at cultivating musical talent from the earliest stages of the lives of Venezuelan children and young people, through the training of orchestral groups ranging from children's symphonies to pre youth, youth, and regional orchestras.

It is based on a teaching-learning process of collective and individual music practice, where its members are guided by teachers and conductors who, in addition to teaching music, train their students in a comprehensive manner with principles of equality, respect, solidarity, commitment, responsibility, teamwork, and a culture of peace.

Orchestral practice has led to the consolidation of groups that have become a faithful example of the social inclusion process that is being carried out, not only in the pursuit of musical excellence, but also in contributing to the strengthening of the human and social capacities of the members to transform them into better people and useful to our nation.

Choir Academic Program.

Following the recognition of the country's choral tradition and easy access in communities, schools, and institutions, El Sistema promoted the creation of the Academic Choral Program to encourage the participation of children and young people who, using their voices as instruments, have offered them a range of opportunities for individual and collective development, contributing to their artistic, humanistic, and intellectual growth.

This program has given rise, for example, to the Niños Cantores de Venezuela (Singing Children of Venezuela), as a demonstration of excellence in their work.

Through the consolidation of its organizational and managerial structure throughout the country, it has established itself as an indispensable methodology for introducing all children and young people who enter the wonderful world of music to choral practice. This program has made progress in the creation of children's and youth choirs and groups of child singers that perform everything from popular Venezuelan, Latin American, and universal genres to high-level symphonic-choral repertoires, taking on the task of bringing choral music to the entire country with excellence and professionalism.

Simon Bolivar Program

It began with the goal of spreading the miracle of music and expanding the social impact of El Sistema. It is aimed at promoting the experiential development of musical initiation in children and adolescents in schools belonging to our country's basic education subsystem, with the purpose of teaching this population the benefits of music and the values that come with it.

Through school modules, music becomes a guide, accompanying children at key stages of their development and linking formal education with the pedagogical strategies of collective music practice that allow for the inclusion and integration of children and young people into the world of music, whether instrumental or choral, through workshops, sections, and rehearsals groups.

In their pedagogical practice, academic music trainers communicate and expose members to the following academic and artistic elements: musical language, vocal technique, the cuatro instrument, the psycho pedagogical and legal bases for music teaching, teaching methodologies applied to music education, methodological aspects, planning and evaluation, and articulation with the program content of the school context. This pedagogical-musical training model is taught in hundreds of schools and high schools throughout the country, where El Sistema teachers make teamwork, tolerance, and respect a daily exercise in the student 's coexistence.

Alma Llanera Program

This program, designed to promote the country's indigenous cultural values, has transcended the boundaries of music education, becoming a movement that preserves and disseminates Venezuela's musical heritage. It seeks to spread the customs of the regions through the playing of traditional instruments and singing, exalting Venezuelan music in its different expressions, from joropo in the plains states, to gaita in Zulia, Andean and Eastern music, galerón, tamunangue larense, among other genres that involve the playing of traditional musical instruments such as: cuatro, guitar, double bass, bandola tachirense, bandola llanera, bandola oriental, mandolin, cumacos, culo'e puya, the venezuelan harp, maracas, and double bass.

The program is classified into seven levels: Complementary cuatro for pre-children aged 5 to 6, compulsory complementary cuatro for all new participants aged 6 to 17, cuatro orchestras for performers aged 6 to 7, Alma Llanera children's orchestras for those aged 8 to 12, Alma Llanera Youth Orchestras for members aged 13 to 17, Alma Llanera Regional Orchestras with members aged 18 to 28 and Professional Orchestras for musicians aged 18 and over. Music theory and choral singing are compulsory for all ages. This program benefits from the valuable participation of cultural practitioners, along with El Sistema teachers, delving into teaching and learning strategies for Venezuelan music, music reading, and the promotion of our nation's enormous cultural heritage.

PROGRAMA DE MÚSICA POPULAR Y OTROS GÉNEROS

Program Of Popular Music And Other Genres

This program is designed to interpret and disseminate universal popular music genres while providing its members with a comprehensive spectrum of music framed within the strategies, principles, and values of El Sistema, as it is developed in its natural space, the Núcleo.

It works under the management of Joseph Mendoza, this is one of the institution's greatest achievements in terms of music and academics, as it has allowed for the expansion and promotion of a wide range of rhythms and genres. It contributes to the consolidation of jazz, symphonic rock, African American, Latin American, and Caribbean music bands. The pedagogy is also based on the collective practice of music and develops strategies that allow children and young people to approach the world of universal popular music through workshops, sectionals, group rehearsals, as well as academic exhibitions and concerts that showcase the work done in formats, such as chamber groups or ensembles, orchestras and choirs.

This attractive artistic platform offers an eclectic and avant-garde musical movement, applauded by audiences of all ages. El Sistema offers to all its students a vast horizon of artistic and creative possibilities through participation in a wide range of orchestras and groups with a rich diversity of musical genres and styles, from which groups, such as: the Simón Bolívar Latin Caribbean Orchestra, 23 de Enero, Simón Bolívar Symphonic Rock, Simón Bolívar Big Band Jazz, Venezuela Sound System, Sistema Fusion Ensemble, and Alma Llanera Distrito Capital.

Special Needs Program

This program was created to cultivate the potential of children, young people, and adults with special educational needs. It includes hearing, visual, cognitive, and motor impairments, learning difficulties, autism, Down syndrome, and other conditions, providing them with tools to participate in collective artistic activities.

It offers optimal spaces and conditions for the physical, motor, and cognitive development of its members, promoting excellence in the artistic-musical field through love, tolerance, and respect. It has a wide range of musical offerings: percussion, bell, recorder, and string ensembles, as well as piano and individual instrument lessons, and it is a program dedicated to Venezuelan music.

The pedagogical development is individualized, and a class can last between 15 and 45 minutes, with an initial frequency of once a week. Mixed group classes include 5 to 6 participants, who are supervised by a trainer and a monitor. Academic strategies are adapted to the characteristics of the participants.

Health Care Program

It was created to provide musical training for children and young people that are hospitalized with chronic illnesses, the program also facilitates their integration into the musical centers of their communities. In this way, music becomes a therapeutic tool. Through contact with music, the program helps to reduce the levels of anxiety and stress caused by each pathology in its members, which also promotes the family patient-doctor relationship.

The main objective of the PAH is to accompany participants during the rehabilitation process and their stay in health centers. In addition, it enables the social integration of participants through educational support during and after their recovery process, using music as a tool for personal development and motivation.

This program promotes academic performances and concerts that highlight the work of chamber groups or ensembles from each hospital where the program operates, in order to encourage interaction between participants and the community, their families, teachers and the general public.

It currently operates in hospitals in Caracas, as well as in the states of Portuguesa, Táchira and Nueva Esparta. Its implementation is planned for Mérida in the near future.

Academic Penitenciary Program

It is a pioneering and transformative initiative in the field of social reintegration. Through music, these programs offer incarcerated people the opportunity to develop social skills and cultivate fundamental values such as discipline, teamwork and perseverance.

It aims to transform the lives of women and men incarcerated in a detention center, with the purpose of instilling social values through the discipline of music and dignifying inmates in order to help them overcome adversity while completing their sentences. This pedagogical-musical training model is developed with the same structure that counts with individual classes, group workshops, s2ectional, and group practice.

It is based on the development of percussion ensembles, cuatro, guitar, Alma Llanera, Afro-Caribbean music ensembles, Afro-Venezuelan music ensembles, choir and orchestra. In this way, the principles of camaraderie, solidarity, respect, commitment, and a sense of belonging, among others, are promoted, which lead to minimizing levels of violence within Venezuelan prisons, favoring a healthy coexistence within the facilities. The program carried out in collaboration with the Venezuelan Ministry of Justice and the Venezuelan Ministry of Culture.

This program is being implemented in seven adult prisons: Los Teques, Táchira, Guárico, Coro, Margarita, Ramo Verde, Barinas y Ciudad Bolívar; 12 juvenile detention centers: Coche, Mérida, Coro, Caracas, Guanare, Yaracuy, Bolívar, San Cristóbal, Miranda and Apure.

LUTHERY ACADEMIC PROGRAM

This program was created with the purpose of providing the required knowledge and tools to develop the social-productive task that includes the maintenance, repairing and building of classic and popular music instruments that are used in the different orchestras and groups of El Sistema.


It offers rigorous technical, historical, scientific, and artistic training dedicated to educating highly professional lutheries, with a bachelor's degree, who have the opportunity to practice this art and become skilled workers within the industry.

The academic structure includes theoretical and practical curriculum units, which are developed in a blended learning format by trainers from different specialties. Teachers apply instructional strategies so that students acquire the skills required by the program.

The members of this program receive the necessary training to become teachers inside and outside the country, the sown knowledge in children and young people about the preventive and corrective maintenance of instruments, which contributes to strengthening their sense of belonging to the resources with music is performed.

This program counts with two Ateliers in Distrito Capital y Miranda, y uno en los estados Anzoátegui, Aragua, Bolívar, Falcón, Guárico, Lara, Sucre, Táchira and Yaracuy.

Academic Training Program

Through the Academic Training Program, teachers are responsible for educating the thousands of children and young people that are trained throughout the network of núcleos and modules that belong to El Sistema. The aim is to offer musicians in every state of the country the opportunity to join this program, in order that they can receive specialized, updated and useful academic tools that will benefit the comprehensive musical training of the children and young people they are responsible for.

In addition, training processes are generated for the academic staff working in the Núcleos and Modules in order to respond in a timely manner to the methodological principles of collective practice of music with high quality standards, based on the identifying the needs of the talent working in different parts of El Sistema's structure such as areas of management, teaching, music and human development.
